MINUTES OF THE LSV GROUP MEMBERSHIP MEETING OCTOBER 18, 2005

The meeting was called to order by Roger Oldenkamp, substituting for Dan Karleskint at 10:00 AM at the Kilaga Springs Presentation Hall. There were 54 present. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by President, Bob Nawman. New members introduced themselves, and guests were welcomed.

Gerry Lammerding, Day Trips Coordinator briefed everyone on the October 20 day trip to Coloma-Jackson, and the November 17 trip to Apple Hill. There is still space for the Apple Hill day trip.

Diane Maker, Social Coordinator reminded everyone of the LSV Group logo clothing available for purchase, and stated the December 6 Christmas Dinner was now open for reservations.

Harry Maker reported on the success of the recent Ford Think Clinic held at Duncan's Automotive in Lincoln. He also stated there would be two Car Rallies held in 2006, they being the fourth Sunday of May and the fourth Sunday of September, pending on the availability of the Sports Pavilion.

Lillian Nawman, Secretary-Treasurer stated there was \$2,166.00 in the bank checking account with all bills paid. Lillian also reminded members to check out e-mails, advise when there is an e-mail address change, phone number change or home address change. Comment was made on the day trips and social calendar being planned for 2006, when all venues and dates have been confirmed with the Association.

Bob Nawman, President noted that members should not connect their LSV's to any electric plug within the Association grounds or buildings, until a clear understanding is reached through a conversation with the Association Executive Director to see if the Sports Pavilion plugs can be used. He also spoke of his experience regarding caution when bikers and walkers are in the bike line when the LSV is using a bike lane at the time of pulling over for passing traffic.

Member Larry Schurr mentioned his ability to put a special pack on the GEM to remind drivers that the directional signal is on. One can obtain his assistance for a \$35 fee to acquire this pack installation.

An Open Forum followed with questions from the audience including: would there be another public hearing on the Lincoln Transportation Plan, best way to park your LSV in the garage, batteries, and maintenance availability for GEM's.

Judy Trokey introduced Jerry Logan, our featured speaker who is a Lincoln historian. His talk was very interesting as he spoke of Indian legends, folklore, the beginnings of Lincoln in the 1800s, railroad into Lincoln, some historic buildings that still stand, and the agricultural, coal and clay commerce that resulted from discoveries of the products within the region. There was also gold discovered in the Auburn Ravine in the early days, and spoke of the water patterns within this region. He can provide a walking tour of Lincoln sometime, and the group will consider this as a special trip in 2006.

To close the meeting, Cary Alcombrack, President of Liberty Motors of Grass Valley gave a short talk about their plans to work with GEM, provide maintenance service to our area very soon, and their presence being planned within the Lincoln business community. It was an encouraging note. He and Steve Alcombrack had trailered over two GEMs for interested people to test drive and observe the newest models. It is their plan to do this for each month's membership meeting until they have something definite for a display area within the Lincoln city area.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 11:40 AM.
