The city's new 'village concept', is in the formation stage and the city is making plans to participate in the All America City competition in 2006 in Anaheim, CA. Roger Oldenkamp reminded everyone to take care of their vehicle during the upcoming winter months.

Member Tex Hines stated he is still looking into information of providing a sun visor for the LSV's.

The automatic shut off of the turning signal is still being available if a member wishes to contact Larry Scherr, who will be able to install one for a fee.
