 MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES
 TUESDAY, MARCH 21, 2006 KILAGA SPRINGS PRESENTATION HALL**

The meeting was called to order by President, Bob Nawman, at 10:00 AM. Gerry Lammerding led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. Guests and new members were requested to introduce themselves and state where they moved from, and the type of LSV vehicle they owned.

Al Roten, Chairman of the Association's Nominations Committee for the recent Association Board of Director's election, presented a certificate of appreciation to the following LSV members who participated in the recent 'get out the vote' campaign, by driving their LSV's in a caravan to promote the election in the various Lincoln Hills neighborhoods. Those members were: Bill Asher, Bill and Pat Cooms, Ernie Farrington, Paul Fettig, Elliott and Gwen Holden, Paul and Diane Kroll, Gerry and Barbara Lammerding, Judy Trokey, Dorothea Jenkins, Ed Miller, Rich Regan, and Eileen and Paul Ternullo (who had the best decorated LSV in the group, and were also awarded a gift certificate for a meal at the Meridian Dining Room at Lincoln Hills). We are proud of this group and their community spirit.

Audrey Gibert introduced Colleen Belche of the DMV as our featured speaker who related the conditions and requirements in order to secure some special types of driver's licenses. Colleen regularly travels to Lincoln Hills to give driving tests for those who have a vision and physical challenge, in order to award a license and to help that individual maintain his/her independence. She noted that our group members should write a letter of appreciation to the DMV indicating how important it has been to have this service offered to our community and particularly to LSV owners, and also golf cart owners. This type of special service is called an 'area drive' where the individual shows the tester just where they will drive within the community and then it is noted in the report by the tester, and the license based on that information.

Colleen left several booklets on various topics for distribution to members, plus the 2005 vehicle code booklet. She stated that when one reaches 70 years of age there is a requirement that you should have a written test when renewing a driver's license. She also mentioned the importance of notifying the DMV when an accident occurs in addition to the insurance company. The LSV Group secretary was requested to write a letter to the DMV from the LSV Group showing our appreciation of this service for the past years, and will put a copy of this letter on the group website and also send it as a sample for the membership to follow. There were many good questions from the audience following her talk.

Gerry Lammerding, Day Trips Coordinator reported on the April 19 Sierra Railroad Wildflower Trip, which sold out very early; and the additional Sierra Railroad trip on May 3rd for members.

Diane Maker, who is responsible for accumulating orders for the logo apparel, stated that there are sufficient orders received and will soon be placing that order for the members of various items.

Lillian Nawman, Secretary-Treasurer reminded the audience to pick up the flyers at the check in table for the day trip/social events scheduled for the year, and the sheet showing the different LSV dealers information on addresses, etc. if they have not already done so.

The current back balance in the Group's checking account is \$2,396.55 with all bills paid.

There are currently, as of this date, 304 members representing 158 households.

An Open Forum period for the members followed to ask questions and make statements.

The attendance at this meeting was 69. The next membership meeting is Tuesday, April 18 with Lt. Paul Shelgren of the Lincoln Police Department as the speaker. There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 11:30 AM.
