LINCOLN HILLS LSV GROUP MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES
TUESDAY, APRIL 18, 2006 KILAGA SPRINGS PRESENTATION HALL

The meeting was called to order by Bob Nawman, President at 10:00 AM. The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was led by Judy Trokey. A welcome was expressed to all guests and new members, who were also asked to stand and give their names and their former home region. There were 59 members present.

The President announced that we had special representatives at the meeting. Chris Le Blanc of Miles Automotive Group, and Steve Ainsworth of MHM Engineers were visiting us today and in attendance.

Gerry Lammerding, Day Trip Coordinator reminded everyone of the April 19th Sierra Railroad trip (a sellout), and a second similar rail trip on May 3rd.

Diane Maker reported that the Luau will be a catered event on October 15, and the December 7 annual Christmas dinner party will be held at Buonaratti's in Lincoln. Diane also asked for volunteer helpers for these parties.

Harry Maker explained what the Poker Run Rally and Potluck will be like on May 21st held at the Sports Pavilion. He also stated that he understands that the AAA will no longer tow your LSV for service. More on this in the future after investigation.

Lillian Nawman, Secretary-Treasurer reported a checking account bank balance of \$1,998.86 with all bills paid, including the self-supporting rail trips. Lillian read a letter addressed to the Auburn DMV written on March 23rd requesting the DMV to continue the on site driving test conducted by Colleen Belche from their office, to Lincoln Hills residents with physical and vision impairment. The members agreed by raised hands that we should submit a petition to their office, with signatures taken at the May 16 membership meeting and send again to the DMV to show our concern for any withdrawal of this program.

Our featured speaker was Tom Raybuck, substitute for Lt. Paul Shelgren, of the Lincoln Police Department. He spoke of his position as a motorcycle policeman relating to traffic rules, radar use within the community, speed limit changes in the city and different MPH signs that will soon change and/or be into effect. There are 2 motorcycle policemen in Lincoln patrolling the city and freeway area. They are increasing their work in issuing tickets for people not wearing their seat belts. He also spoke of bicyclists not stopping at signals and stop signs, and they hope to start cracking down on this more.
