

**LINCOLN HILLS LSV/NEV GROUP MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES
TUESDAY, January 15, 2008 KS LODGE PRESENTATION HALL**

The meeting was called to order by President Dan Karleskint at 10:00 AM. New members/guests were asked to introduce themselves.

The guest speaker was John Pedri, City Engineer Director of Public Works. His talk was "State of the NEV Program for 2008". John reviewed his background and then went over what has transpired so far and what will be coming up in 2008.

- Completed NEV Transportation plan in 2006. City is trying to push the use of electric vehicles.
- Went over the State Code AB2353 which was approved 1/1/05. Also discussed the approvals of the State Code. Noted benefits of NEV: Air quality, saves gas, zero emissions.
- Discussed Design Elements: Putting together standards for businesses before they are built such as charging stations, designated parking and routes to serve these businesses.
- Signage: In the next two months to a year hope to have all signs installed.
- Showed a map of NEV and golf card routes.
- Also discussed the various Road Classifications: Class I, II & III
- City has noted that using electric vehicles in Lincoln has brought down the speed of other vehicles.

John talked about the plans for 2008:

- AB2353 report should be on the City website soon.
- Technical Advisory Group meetings are on a quarterly basis. Their intent is to come together and look at the future of electric vehicles.
- Stripping and signing projects for 2008: Showed a slide with dates for various completions.
- Also looking at signs when entering Lincoln to indicate that they are entering an electric vehicle city.
- Received Grant money for these projects in the amount of \$800,000.

John discussed some of the challenges:

- Merging to make a left turn
- Charging stations and parking stalls
- Sharing lanes with bikes
- Working with Rocklin to help implement a Regional Plan.

John also talked about new projects:

- The Center's Bridge/Safeway to Raley's . Looking at a trail and bridge across Auburn Ravine, and he showed a map. Also, another concept would be to go across reserves.
- A trail and bridge to the Post Office & movie theaters.

All of these have not been approved as yet.

John listed some of the awards and recognition for Lincoln's NEV Transportation Plan:

- 2006 League of California Cities Helen Putnam Award
- 2007 Caltrans Excellence In Transportation Award for transportation innovations.
- 2007 Tranny Award

John answered various questions from the members. One of the members mentioned that we should invite a representative from Thunder Valley to discuss the road to the Casino, and the possibility of driving our NEV's there.

Dan mentioned the Association elections and suggested we should follow the directions so our vote is counted.

Gerry Lammerding went over our day trips for 2008.

OPEN FORUM: Someone suggested we invite the Executive Director of the Association to one of our meetings.

Our guest speaker for the February 19th meeting will be Jackie Gonzales from the DMV.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 11:20 PM. We had a wonderful turnout of 93 members in attendance. The next LSV/NEV membership meeting will be Tuesday, February 19, 2008 at 10:00 AM at KS Lodge Presentation Hall.
